In today's lesson we are consolidating and will be playing a game that incorporates our knowledge of British coins and finding an amount with them,


Key questions

Can my child find an amount using coins?

Language to be used

Use the correct terms for the coins. For example one pence or 1p. If you talk about £1 or £2 coins remember to remind your children they are not called 100 and 200p.

Begin with - How?

Play this fun game with your child as an engaging way to help them practise naming the UK coins and adding them together to make the set totals. How many different ways can your child find to make the amounts?

We use money in our daily lives; it is a real-life skill. Being able to recognise what all the coins are worth and how to add them together is a vital area of maths for your child to learn.

You can play this game by following the rules described or you could try challenging your child to show all the possible ways of making each amount.

SHOW ME THE MONEY

There are many different ways of making amounts of money.

Playing this game together can help your child practise recognising and using different coins.

Instructions (Note you may need to assist at times)

1. Print and cut out the coins and the circles with the target amounts on.
2. Place the coins into a bag (or a container that you can't see inside).
3. Place the target circles face down and choose one each, at random.
4. Each player takes it in turns to select one coin at a time from the bag:
 - if the coin **can** be used to make their target amount, place it onto the circle;
 - if it **can't** be used to make their target amount, place it next to the circle.
5. Continue pulling coins out of the bag until one player reaches the total amount on their circle.
6. The first person to make their amount wins and keeps the target circle.
7. All players return the coins to the bag and select new target circles.
