

# All About Putney



## Week 1

### Activity 1

For your first activity, we would like you to draw a map of your local area. Look at maps online, find out about how maps are drawn, use colours, labels and maybe even design some symbols and a key.

Google Maps is a great place to start.

Different year groups may draw different things from a simple map of your street to more complicated maps that cover a wider area. You can see some examples below of what these maps might look like.



These are all great examples of maps. Think creatively about how you're going to show your local area.

### Activity 2

For your second activity, we would like you to explore some of the key events in Putney's history. You could explore questions like... What was it originally called? When did it become part of London? When was Putney Bridge built (and was it always called Putney Bridge)? When did the river freeze so people could cross for free? When did the boat race start?

You could talk to an older relative or resident (by Skype call of course) and write or draw about the things they tell you.

Present the work however you want. A poster about the history of Putney, a mindmap of facts, an information text, a piece of art or a time line of key events in the history. Could you be even more creative? How about a TV show!

I look forward to finding out everything you find out.

### Bonus Activity 3

As a third activity this week I'd like you to do a weather study of Putney over the next 5 weeks.

Each day, record what the weather was like and what the temperature was. You could use the internet or TV news or an outdoor thermometer to find this out.

If you want to take it a step further, you could build a simple weather station.
