In maths, we have been learning about multiplication through arrays and have enjoyed creating our own pictorial representations.

In history, we continued our learning on Queen Victoria and considered why certain objects represented the era she reigned.

Year 3

Year 3 have been working amazingly well this week, whether it be at home or in school. They have shown great patience, consideration of others and resilience during the last couple of weeks and we are very proud of them.

This week, Willow and Sycamore class have been working together with Miss Hopson, whilst Mr Lepine has been looking after all of our online learners. The children have worked tremendously hard with their English learning, maths and topic work. In school, the children have been working on their own stories which have been innovated from George's Marvellous Medicine. Their stories are creative, funny and engaging and the children have incorporated many literary devices in their work. In maths, we are working on applying our knowledge of times tables to problem solving. The children have demonstrated great times tables knowledge, and they know how to use arrays and other concrete methods to show this.

We have also started to look at different Christmas traditions from here and Europe. We learnt about a rather scary one called the Krampus! Naughty children beware – he will not be handing out any candy canes like St. Nicholas!!

We are fast approaching our Christmas concert, and we would like to remind the children to continue to practise their songs and learn all of their words. Some of the children will be receiving their Christmas tree decoration to decorate at home this weekend, please try and complete it ready to return for Monday.

We cannot wait to have all of the children in year 3 back to school over the next week or so. We thank all of our children and parents for their support during this difficult time.

Year 4



This week Year 4 have been continuing to rewrite the plot points for our class text 'Moon Man' by Tomi Ungerer. The children are really enjoying the story and they are working hard to improve the vocabulary they are using in their writing. Next week, the children will be planning their own version of the story and then they will be writing it up!

In maths, the children have started a unit of work on multiplication and division. The lessons have included the use of place value charts to help the children understand what happens when we multiply or divide a number by 10, 100 or 1000. Next week, we will continue to work on multiplying and dividing with a particular focus on the 3 and 6 times table.

As part of our theme this half term, Citizenship and the World, the children have been learning about lines of longitude and lines of latitude. They have used this information to work out the co-ordinates of different places on our planet. They have also explored the different climate zones and have plotted these on a map.

Today, we were very lucky to receive a visit from Caroline and Anna who are from The Latin Programme! They carried out two sessions with year 4 and year 5. The first session taught the children about women in the ancient world. The children were also told a story based on Ancient Rome that included some artefacts. Using Caroline Lawrence's model for a good story, the children work together to plan their own! In the second session, the children started to learn some Latin and they practised saying different phrases such as 'mea mater Alison est'.




Year 5

This week, we have been recovering from our fantastic day out at Wimbledon Rugby Club. The children all took part in a Year 5 and 6 rugby festival last Friday where they had the opportunity to play short friendly games against lots of other schools. Also, this week the children have been continuing multiplication in maths and have consolidated their knowledge of cube and square numbers. In writing, the children have been exploring balanced arguments where the children have been able to apply their skills from 'Debate Mate' into these sessions.

In geography, the children have been exploring the difference between weather and climate. They had a fun activity where they had to match the picture to the correct climate zones. They were then able to use this key terminology in a post card to a friend.

Lastly, in R.E, the children have been exploring the 10 Gurus and they created a poster in groups focussing on two. They then presented these to the class and were able to compare the different Gurus in a class discussion.

Dear Parents and Carers,


