BACON & LEEK MINI QUICHES

I find bacon and leek are a match made in heaven and so it's a given these mini quiches go down a treat. I made these for my son's birthday party recently and they were a huge success with both the kids and the parents.

These mini quiches are everything they're cracked up to be. Dairy free and gluten free, they taste great fresh out of the oven but even better straight from the fridge. Perfect to have on hand for a quick healthy protein snack or top on a nutritious green salad for lunch.

Course: Snacks

Prep Time: 15 mins

Cook Time: 20 mins

- 6-8 rashers of bacon, fat trimmed and chopped
 - 2 leeks, trimmed, halved lengthways and finely sliced
 - 10 eggs
 - 1 tablespoon of wholegrain mustard
 - 2 tablespoons of fresh parsley finely chopped (or chives)
 - 1 tablespoon of dried mixed herbs
 - 1 teaspoon pepper
 - Pinch of salt
 - Coconut or olive oil for sautéing
 - Optional: 1 tablespoon nutritional yeast (to replace parmesan flavour)
- Preheat oven to 160C and grease muffin tins. For kid's parties I use the muffin tray that has 24 small muffin holes.
 - In a frying pan heat up the oil and sauté the bacon and leeks until cooked through for a few minutes and then set aside.
 - In a large bowl whisk together the eggs, mustard, parsley, mixed herbs and seasoning. Add the cooled leek and bacon mixture to the rest of the ingredients and combine well.
 - Spoon into muffin holes and place in the oven and bake for approximately 20 minutes. Allow to cool before serving.


"Books are a uniquely portable magic." (S. King)

On behalf of Oasis Zimbabwe please accept my sincere thanks and appreciation for the support you have given us through your fundraising.

The money you have raised has helped us to cover our core costs in order for us to be able to run a variety of projects. For example we have been able to continue to run our Tanaka Home where we look after abused girls. We have achieved a lot in terms of assisting the children by mentoring and caring for them, and seeing their behaviour change over time. Their language and communication skills have improved and they are functioning so much better in our family setting. Where appropriate, we have been able to help the Department of Child Welfare to reunify some of the girls with their families, and helped many of them to go back to school. We have also assisted with the process of court cases and it was encouraging to see justice done for these vulnerable children. We work hard to protect the children's rights and promote best practice in processing their cases.


