#### Foyer

Please note the foyer is **NOT** waiting area for parents to congregate before or after school.

#### Late arrivals.

If on the rare occasion your child is late, you MUST sign them in and allow your child to walk through to their classroom unaccompanied. For safeguarding reasons parents are not allowed into the school without a prior appointment. Should you wish to speak with a teacher this can be done at drop off or pick up or by making an appointment with your class teacher directly.

#### Parking, Car drop-off and pick-up.

**Cars are not allowed on the school premises** unless you are a blue badge holder. Parking and waiting in front of the gate is also not permitted. This obstructs residents and authorised vehicles from entering the private road.

Blue badge holders will need to initially present their badge and number plate to the office prior to parking and display on your dashboard once parked in the disabled bay.

If you need to travel by car, please park in a nearby side street and be particularly considerate of local residents. These rules also apply to those dropping children off after medical appointments or volunteering at the school/for school trips.

#### Lunches

If your child wishes to change to school meal or to packed lunches, we require written confirmation to the office via email from a parent or carer before the day they wish to change. <a href="mailto:info@oasisputney.org">info@oasisputney.org</a>

#### **Medical Appointments**

There has been an increase in the number of medical appointments taking place during school hours, particularly dental.

Please can we remind you that only emergency appointments should be booked during school hours and every effort must be made to seek appointments after school or at the weekend.

Please only provide clothes that you don't mind getting dirty as the children have a very hands on experience. 
#### Our learning this week...

Year 6 have had a great start to the year. They have come back with a positive mindset and optimistic about the year ahead. We have spent some time reminding ourselves of the school rules and expectations, as well as the children thinking about their goals for the year ahead. We also remined ourselves of the importance of the 9 habits. We considered how we can demonstrate each of the habits and thought about how embracing these habits might help us to achieve our goals.

In PSHE, we learned about self-regulation and considered different strategies we can adopt to help us regulate our emotions. We also thought about the different ways we can show kindness this year and in particular how we can show kindness through our words and actions.

In maths, we have started our first topic on place value. The children have been embedding their understanding of numbers up to 10,000,000.

In English, we started our new book: There's a Boy in the Girl's Bathroom. We learnt some facts out the author Louis Sacher and began to think about what we learnt about the main character, Bradley, from the first chapter.
