Foyer

Please note the foyer is **NOT** waiting area for parents to congregate before or after school.

Late arrivals.

If on the rare occasion your child is late, you MUST sign them in and allow your child to walk through to their classroom unaccompanied. For safeguarding reasons parents are not allowed into the school without a prior appointment. Should you wish to speak with a teacher this can be done at drop off or pick up or by making an appointment with your class teacher directly.

Parking, Car drop-off and pick-up.

Cars are not allowed on the school premises unless you are a blue badge holder. Parking and waiting in front of the gate is also not permitted. This obstructs residents and authorised vehicles from entering the private road.

Blue badge holders will need to initially present their badge and number plate to the office prior to parking and display on your dashboard once parked in the disabled bay.

If you need to travel by car, please park in a nearby side street and be particularly considerate of local residents. These rules also apply to those dropping children off after medical appointments, picking up sick children or volunteering at the school/for school trips.

Lunches

If your child wishes to change to school meal or to packed lunches, we require written confirmation to the office via email from a parent or carer before the day they wish to change. info@oasisputney.org

Medical Appointments

There has been an increase in the number of medical appointments taking place during school hours, particularly dental.

Please can we remind you that only emergency appointments should be booked during school hours and every effort must be made to seek appointments after school or at the weekend.

Reception

Our learning this week...

This week we have had lots more visits from the phonics fairy and have now learnt 4 sounds – s, a, t, p! Please take a look on Seesaw to find the home learning videos. We have also been reading the story of the 3 Little Pigs and the children have enjoyed creating houses mad eout of straw, sticks and bricks. They have been testing which material is the strongest and have shown good teamwork skills. In Maths we have been focusing on all things related to number 1 – number formation, 1 in the environment, circles, doing an action once, what it means to be first and finally using our reasoning skills to decide if 1 is always the same.

The children have all tried really hard in their phonis lessons this week and have loved taking part in the different activities the phonics fairy has left for us. They particularly enjoyed the t t tea party and p p pirate Pete!

Important parent information for next week:

- Every Wednesday, the children will be having their PE lesson with Mr Dylan. Please ensure
 your child has their PE clothes in school on this day. Children are welcome to keep their PE
 bags on their peg all term to ensure they always have them. All items of clothes MUST be
 labelled clearly with your child's name. Children in Reception should be able to change most
 of their clothes independently, so please continue to practice this skill at home.
- Every Friday, the children will have Outdoor Learning with Mrs Davies. For this, the children need to have a waterproof jacket, waterproof trousers, and welly boots (all items should be clearly labelled with your child's name). Please only provide clothes that you don't mind getting dirty as the children have a very hands on experience. We also require a parent volunteer to attend each week so please sign up on the sheet on the classroom door.
- This week you should have received an email inviting you to join your child's profile on Seesaw. Please sign up to this and keep your notifications turned on, as this is how we will share the amazing things your children do at school. This is also where you will find the daily phonics videos for your children to practice their learning at home.

Our learning this week...

In Maths this week, Birch Class ordered objects and numbers and looked at using a number line. The children completed their first end of unit assessment on place value and started looking at our new topic of addition and subtraction. In English, we sequenced the Stardust story and included lots of exciting vocabulary in our plans; we will use our plans to help us retell the story next week. In geography, we looked at our local area and wrote down why it is special to us. In history, we placed our photos on a timeline (the photos will be sent home this Friday in the children's homework books – thank you for bringing them in). In art, we looked at geometric and organic shapes and used oil pastels to create some pictures using the two different types of shape. In phonics, we recapped the sounds: sh, th, ng and ai. We went outside to find the hidden 'snails' and read the words that contained the 'ai' digraph to our partners and the adults. In handwriting this week, we practised writing the letters 'r', 'm', 'b' and 'p'. Please look out for extra handwriting practice sheets in your homework books this week.


Our learning this week...
