This time in Outdoor Learning

Year 1 have been busy traversing the galaxies through their space theme. Last week they visited 'Planet Litter' and after discussing the problems of plastic pollution on the Common they carried out a litter pick on the school grounds and local area, sorting the litter into recyclable and general waste. This week, they travelled to 'Planet Love' where they planted a heart on the playground at their favourite spot and then created their own valentines smelly alien potions (beware – apparently these range from making you extra strong to making butterflies appear everywhere you go!).

Year 2 also enjoyed a few heart themed activities from Hapa-zome (the Japanese art of leaf bashing to dye fabric) to creating their own heart wraps to say thank you to someone special.

Reception had the best time ever as they visited 'Planet Puddle' and decided that in actual fact sticks weren't the best way to measure how deep the puddles were - all you needed to do was to jump right in them!!



RECEPTION

Our learning...

Over the past few weeks we have been busy learning lots of new information. We have learnt about different types of dinosaurs, when they lived, what their diet was and how we know they exist today. We also learnt about famous palaeontologists such as Mary Anning and even had a go at discovering dinosaur bones in our tuff tray. We have also been learning all about Space. The children can now name the planets and talk about some key information for each planet. We also learnt about some famous astronauts such as Valentina Tereshkova and Neil Armstrong. The children also enjoyed reading the story Beegu and creating alien friends for her. We have also learnt lots of new sounds and words in phonics and have now learnt all of the phase 3 tricky words! In Maths we have been learning about doubling and halving with numbers up to 10.

- We learnt about how to be safe online during Safer Internet day which was especially important for Reception who will soon be receiving their iPads!
- During Children's Mental Health week, we spoke about the importance of keeping our minds healthy and happy. All the children were asked to think about who their trusted adults are and what they need to do if they feel worried about anything. Our learning...

In phonics, we learnt the sounds e-e (as in theme), i-e (as in bike), o-e (as in mole) and u-e (as in flute). Please remember to watch the practice videos found in the parent resources section on Showbie. In maths, we started our unit on addition and subtraction to 20. The children looked at adding by counting on and used number lines to complete addition and subtraction equations. In writing lessons, the children wrote their own stories based on the book, 'George and the dragon'. It was lovely to read their imaginative ideas. In geography, the children looked at maps and aerial images of our school and of Buckingham Palace. They compared the maps and images and discussed what was similar and different. In art, the children painted a picture of Queen Elizabeth II, and they also created a collage of her. In RE, the children looked at the Bible and wrote down some facts about it. This week was mental health week and the children discussed and drew/wrote down some of their proudest moments. The children loved reading 'Daisy, eat your peas', during our reading comprehension lessons.

In maths, we are learning about multiplication and division. This week the children completed grouping and sharing lessons with Mrs Begum and they looked at multiplying and dividing by 2 with Miss Pickering. In English, the children have started to look at a biography all about Mary Seacole. They have been looking carefully at the structure of a biography and they will be writing their own, based upon Queen Victoria, when we return to school.

In science this week the children learnt how paper is made. They know that trees get chopped down and taken to the paper mill and they can explain the process of how the wood is turned into paper.

Our learning...

As we come to the end of the half term, we can look back at brilliant learning - from some excellent independent writes and advertising work in English, to understanding measurements, conversions and perimeter in maths. In History, we have concluded our learning with some wonderful pupil-led explanations of the different tools used during the Iron Ages, and in geography we used the online tool 'digimaps' to apply some of our compass work when finding directions to nearby landmarks. In art, we have paired our learning with our studies into Islamic traditions, replicating similar colours and patterns. In reading, the class have made excellent progress in their assessment scores, with many jumping up and therefore accessing new texts within our ever-growing library.

We look forward to returning in a weeks time, refreshed and ready to keep learning!

Our learning...

We have reached the end of Spring 1 and how quickly this half term has passed by!

The children have worked incredibly hard this half term and have produced excellent pieces of writing based on our book- Edward Tulane. They have written diary entries and narrative journeys where they have used a range of compositional features and are becoming wonderful authors themselves.

In maths, we have reached the end of our unit on multiplication and division, and we will be moving onto

fractions and decimals and continuing with perimeter and area.

In our topic learning, we have learnt so much about the Romans and how they were once a republic and then became an empire due to the actions of Julius Caesar! We linked our knowledge of the Romans with our Geography work on maps and how the Romans marched across Europe and invaded so many countries, Britain being one of them!

Our science learning has been all about sustainability and this week we have learnt about the impact of fuels, carbon dioxide and global warming. We learnt about how we need to try and reduce CO2 due to its impact on our world.

The children have continued to enjoy their sessions with Mr. Isdale in drama and clarinet with Theo and Tascha.

Lastly this week, we focussed on our mental health as it is 'Children's Mental Health Week'. We talked about how the theme for this year which is 'My voice matters' and how it is important to be heard and have their opinion taken seriously.



Our learning...

Another busy couple of weeks for Year 5! It was great to share some of the amazing work we've been doing in class with parents/carers last week. I am looking forward to watching the class develop as learners over the course of the next few months, where I can hopefully share even more of our successes at our next parents' evening.

Due to this being a short half term, we have packed an awful lot in over the past two weeks! In maths, we completed our second fractions unit and have moved onto decimals – a topic the class has grasped beautifully so far! In English, we wrote non-chronological reports about a historical period (Vikings, Normans or the Romans), which linked beautifully to our topic lesson, where the children created their very own Bayeux Tapestry detailing the events leading up to and after the Norman Conquest. I can't wait to display this on our working wall. In music, the children composed their own piece of music using percussion instruments, and to top it all off, we worked up a sweat completing our fitness tests for this half term.

Our learning...

Over the last two weeks, in English, Year 6 have been learning to identify the features of newspaper reports and been practising applying them to their writing. This week, they wrote their own newspaper report about the blitz and they have been fantastic!

In maths, the children have demonstrated an excellent understanding of how to solve problems using ratios. They learned how to apply what they have learned about to ratio to increasing proportions in recipes. Feel

free to practise with them over the half term by getting them to bake you something tasty!

In history, the children have thoroughly enjoyed our World War 2 topic. They learned about what life was during The Blitz and they wrote fantastic diary entries about everyday experiences of people living during the war. This learning has been enhanced during our recent trip to The Imperial War Museum. We visited the World War 2 gallery, and the children were brilliantly engaged and enjoyed searching the gallery for the answers to the questions on their worksheet. I was very proud of how well they took to the challenge. In art, the children have been learning how to create artwork using layering and collage. The used cardboard

to create a 3D image of a landscape. Do take a look at their work which has been uploaded to showbie.
