- Girls: Plain white socks for summer
- Sensible black shoes that support the feet No boots, ankle boots or trainers
- A waterproof jacket/ coat at school at all times of the year
- Plain dark winter coat. A navy reversible vortex coat with reflective trim is available from our uniform supplier.

Girls Summer Uniform - Summer Uniform is worn during the first half of the Autumn Term and for the whole of the Summer Term.

Last term our Eco Champions helped each class complete a different area of our school Environmental Review. Have a look at how we scored in the different areas.


ECO-SCHOOLS TARGETS 2023-24

Year 2 did an amazing job this week as they embraced the freezing weather to spot 'birds' hidden in the trees in preparation for our RSPB Birdwatch later in the month. They learnt how to identify common birds by sight and sound and had lots of fun practicing using binoculars... if you would like to join the RSPB Great Garden Bird watch at home, don't forget to check out the RSPB website for more information and resources.

Reception

Our learning this week...

Welcome back! We have hit the ground running and have had a week full of wonderful learning this week! We have started our new topic *Castles and Knights*, which the children have been very engaged with. We have looked at Kings and Queens of England and learnt some interesting facts about them, learnt what features a castle has and why these are important, and we have started to talk about what a knight is and what their role was. In Maths, we have been using the more than and less than signs to compare numbers and have been using the part whole model to create our own number sentences. In Phonics we have been recapping all the sounds we have learnt so far ready to start learning new sounds next week!





Happy News...

As part of our new topic, the children have been busy creating crowns and self-portraits to turn themselves into royalty. They also thought about what rules they would have if they were the King or Queen. Some of them sound as though they would be very strict!

Important parent information for next week:

- Next week we will be starting Show and Tell. Every Friday, the children will be able to bring in one thing from
 home that they would like to show their friends. They will have the opportunity to talk about their chosen item
 and then answer some questions. Please talk to your child each week about their chosen item and practice
 what they are going to say. The item could be a small toy, a photo, a souvenir, something they have made or
 anything else they would like to talk about.
- Please ensure your child is returning their Library book to school each week. They are unable to choose a new book until their current book has been returned.

Our learning this week...

In maths this week, the children continued with their learning on place value to 20. They looked closely at the numbers 17,18,19 and 20 and they used dienes to show one more and one less than numbers within 20. In English, we looked at story writing. The children spent some time creating their own stories with a partner and then they wrote a story using a picture for inspiration. In RE, we looked at the Epiphany and recapped the Nativity story. The children then drew some pictures of the three wise men. In Art, we started our unit on collage. We looked at some pieces of work by Henri Matisse for inspiration and created our own 'snail' pictures. We then cut out lots of organic shapes and worked collaboratively on our tables to create a group picture. In phonics, we learnt the new sounds **ew** and **oe**. The children had to find some of the hairy toes I scattered on their tables. They then had to practise writing the new grapheme and words containing the sound. They also wrote some funny sentences!

The children have settled back very well and have shown a positive attitude to their learning. Our class marble jar is almost full so a treat will be coming very soon!

- Homework will be uploaded onto Showbie this Friday.

Our learning this week...

Welcome back Year 2! We have had a super week! In maths, the children have started our money unit of work beginning with counting in pounds and pence using coins and notes. In our writing lessons, the children have started to read the story 'Grandad's Island' and they have enjoyed some of our 'development days'.

In other subjects we have started new units of work. In science, the children have started to think about the properties of certain materials, and they have been able to sort materials according to their properties. In geography, the focus is on maps, this week the children looked at the difference between plans, maps, and aerial images.

Knowledge organisers for science, geography, history, art and PSHE can be found on Showbie. They show what we will be learning this half term and give ideas about what you can do at home to support this!

Our learning this week...

We have been straight back into work in Year 3, getting through two brilliant plot points in our writing around our new book 'Leon and the place between'. The class gathered some of their best vocabulary and have blown me away. In maths, we have been looking at multiplying 2-digit numbers by 1 digit numbers and recognising the need to partition to help us with the exchanging steps.

In science we have looked at our first super scientist, Mae Johnson, and the life of an astronaut. In history we have begun to explore the transitions from the stone age through to the iron age, and have followed the theme into our artwork, making cave wall style oil pastel drawings.

Our learning this week...


Welcome back everyone to the Spring term!

We have had a full week back already, with new topics to start and our assembly next week to look forward to.

In our writing lessons this week, we have started our new story called The Miraculous Journey of Edward Tulane, where we meet a china rabbit, who is rather rude and arrogant. He is on a journey from New York to London, but we all know that something is going to happen to him!

In maths, we are continuing to learn and deepen our skills in mutiplication and division. It is very clear to see that the children have been using the MTC to practise their times tables. Please make this part of their routines at home, as we want to ensure that they do as best as they can when it comes to the test in summer term.

Our topic learning began this week with our introduction to the Romans and looking at where in Europe they conquered and we used our maps and atlases for this. We also learnt how the Romans based their repulican lifestyle on the Greek democracy system.

Our learning this week...

What a great first week back! Year 5 have worked hard this week and are settling back into our school routines well. In maths, we started a new unit on multiplication and division.

In Topic, we are looking at the Anglo Saxons, Vikings, and Normans – delving into life in Britain, their battles, and impact on life today. This links beautifully to our new book in English – The Viking Boy – which explores a plethora of themes for the children to really get their teeth stuck into. I can't wait to read their finished stories at the end of this unit! Finally, in science, we have started to explore healthy lifestyles – examining what this might incorporate, and how we can improve our own lifestyles to ensure we grow and thrive.

Our learning this week...

This week, Year 6 have settled very well into the new term. They have come focussed and determined and ready to take on the new term!

In English, we started our new book: Rose Blanche. The book focuses on a young girl called Rose and her experience of living in Germany during WW2. The children wrote narratives on a part of the story with the focus of trying to create a threatening mood or atmosphere. There writing was fantastic and their use of specific vocabulary to convey the mood was excellent.

In maths, we have been multiplying and dividing fractions. Again, the children have grasped the concepts quickly and have been able to apply the strategies they have learned to a range of reasoning problems.

In geography, the children did map work on the British Empire. The learned about the countries that were a part of the British Empire and located them on an atlas and then shaded the country on their own blank map.

In history, we have started our new topic on WW2. We looked at the possibles causes of WW2, including The Treaty of Versailles, The Great Depression, and the invasion of Poland (among other reasons!) and considered which one was the main cause of WW2. The children have shown a great enthusiastic for the topic and are keen to learn more.
