Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 have been busy working hard to make some great eco improvements to our school grounds.

During the past two weeks, the children have been busy learning about different types of minibeasts, their features and their habitats. We learnt about the life cycle of a butterfly and learnt a new word "metamorphosis"! In phonics we have been busy learning lots of new sounds and now only have 2 sounds left to learn of phase 3 sounds. In Maths we have been consolidating our understanding of addition and subtraction as well as comparing numbers using the more than and less than symbols.

Our learning...

In maths, we looked at length and height. We compared objects found in the classroom and had to say which objects were longer and which were shorter. We also had to find someone shorter and taller than ourselves. In English, we continued with our plot points and will write our own stories based on the book when we come back after Easter. In phonics, we continued to recap our phase 5 sounds and we completed another practice screening check. In RE, we looked at the Easter story and the children collaged a cross. In science, we looked at properties of materials and the children went on a hunt in the playground to find items that were hard, bumpy and smooth etc. In computing we continued with our programming unit on code.org and we looked at using the repeat block to loop the code. In History, we looked at fashion trends over the decades. We also read some books about fashion and the children discussed what they discovered from the books. The children also became fashion detectives when a child kindly volunteered to dress up and the rest of the children had to work out which decade his outfit was from and explain how they knew.

Our learning...

Maple class have started to learn about capacity and volume. They enjoyed looking at different sized containers and comparing their capacity! In writing, the children finished recording the plot points for Halibut Jackson. They are looking forward to rewriting their own stories when we return! The children have also been developing their sequencing skills in reading comprehension lessons.

This half term, year 2 have been focussing on global goal 3: good health and well-being. They have learnt about the priorities in different countries when it comes to this goal and they learnt that in the UK, the focus is on mental health. To support our school's mental health, the children have come up with an idea that they will introduce to the rest of the school after the Easter break. We will be encouraging children to take part in 'Mindful Mondays'. This will mean that when the children come into the classroom for the soft start, there will be a mindfulness/ well-being activity that they can complete!

What a few weeks we have had as we finish off the Spring term!

In writing, we wrote letters as Hogarth – the boy from the Iron Man – about another creature who had come to terrorise the village. The children had to decide what the new creature would be, and we used a range of non-fiction lenses to support our letter writing.

In maths, the children have made a great start to our topic on decimals, and they are using their knowledge of proper and improper fractions and mixed numbers to support their learning. We will continue with decimals after the Easter break.

In our topic learning, we have completed our work on our Global Goal, and we finished off with a Kahoot quiz, which always adds so much fun to our learning. We also completed our prints this week and got to use our block prints to show how we have used our motifs to overlay design and pattern. Well done to everyone!

Our learning...

Year 5 has been extremely busy over the pat two weeks. We have come to the end of our maths unit on statistics, learning how to draw and interpret graphs with multiple pieces of data. The children learnt that this skill is not as easy as it seems! In English, we wrote diary entries, based on our class book, Skellig. This has been My favourite unit so far with this class – the writing and use of new, exciting vocabulary has been exceptional. Well done everyone.

In science, we tested our our parachutes, exploring how surface area affects air resistance, in turn, slowing down a skydiver's descent. For art and design, we have been exploring different methods of printing with ink (some more successful than others!) and enjoyed getting our hands dirty; whilst in DT, we looked at hydro power and designed our own 'hydro power machine' with household objects. Finally, this week, we enjoyed watching our Putney's Got Talent performers on stage. What a lovely way to end the term.

Our learning...

Over the last two weeks in English, the children have written their own narrative based on an extract from Harry Potter. The children's stories are fantastic, and I have been impressed with all the literary skills they have applied. Well done Year 6!

In science, the children have been continuing to carry out fair tests. They have been investigating what impact adding extra components to a circuit has on the brightness of a light bulb. They have learnt this is called

In maths, the children are finishing up on their algebra unit. They have grasped the concept quickly and have demonstrated an excellent understanding. They are able to us letters to substitute a value and they are able to find the possible value of unknowns e.g.: 2x + y = 18, x could be 5 and y could be 8.

In geography, the children have been making their own interactive videos about Climate Action. First, they wrote and prepared scripts, drawing on all their knowledge they have learned over the years and in this topic about climate change. Then, they recorded their videos, thinking carefully about how to engage their audience and the locations (around the school) for their scenes. They have truly blown me away with what they have produced, and I could not be prouder! Well done Year 6! Please do check out their videos which are saved on My Geography work on Showbie.



Overall, Year 6 have had a great Spring 2 term, and it has been a joy to see how far they have come this year!
